

CMA UPDATE

Wild Country 99's "CMA Party 2018 –Contest Rules:

1. Contestants must be present to win.
2. All 2018 CMA Party guests of the age 18 years or older are eligible to play, unless otherwise specified.
3. Contestants will qualify with the Birthday Game, in order to play the Egg Game to win.
4. The Birthday Game is played by order of elimination. If a contestant was born in a randomly selected month, they are no longer eligible. Months will continue to be randomly selected until there is only one month left at which point days will be randomly selected. If a contestant was born on the selected day, they are no longer eligible. Once there is a final day remaining, the remaining contestants will be called to the main stage.
5. The remaining contestants must provide a legal form of identification to verify their birthday month/day has not been selected.
6. Once verified, contestants will line up determined by the High/Low Game. Wild Country 99 will randomly select a nondescript envelope with either the word "High" or "Low" inside of it. This pertains to the contestants' CMA Party Ticket number and will determine the order the contestants will play the Egg Game, from either high to low or vice versa.
7. Once the order of the contestants has been determined for the Egg Game, contestants will select one plastic egg. Only one egg will contain a winner slip. The contestant who pulls the winning egg wins a 2-year leased 2018 Chevrolet Equinox on approved credit.
8. Wild Country 99 reserves the right to substitute the prize of equal or greater value; winners do not have any right to substitution of a prize.
9. The prize must be claimed by the winner, and is not transferable.
10. Wild Country 99 makes no warranties regarding the safety, condition, or fitness of any prizes awarded, and will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury suffered by a winner through the use of any awarded prize.
11. The winner is solely responsible for all taxes, duties, or other costs that may be associated with the winning of a prize.
